# Import Promotion Desk introduces Brazil as a new partner country at Fruit Attraction in Madrid

Over 30 producers from Egypt, Brazil, Côte d'Ivoire, Ecuador, Kenya, Colombia, Morocco, and Peru to showcase a wide variety of fresh fruit and vegetables: Hall 12 Stand D11

**Bonn/Berlin,** 13 August 2025 – The Import Promotion Desk (IPD) is expanding its portfolio of fresh fruit and vegetables and is proud to present Brazil as a new partner country at Fruit Attraction, taking place from 30 September to 2 October in Madrid. The Brazilian offering includes mangoes, grapes, limes, lychees, and yams. A total of seven Brazilian companies will be present in person at the fair – providing an excellent opportunity for buyers to engage directly with producers on topics such as product range, cultivation practices, quality management, logistics, and delivery conditions: **Hall 12 Stand D11**.

#### **Expanding the mango offering**

Among the newly represented Brazilian companies are mango producers who will complement IPD's existing supplier base from South America and Africa. The Brazilian exporters specialise in varieties such as Palmer, Tommy Atkins, Kent, and Keitt. Two of these companies operate plantations in the São Francisco Valley in the northeast of the country. There, mangoes grow in calcium-rich soil – which, according to the producers, contributes to a firmer peel and consequently longer shelf life for the highly perishable fruit.

Mango producers from Egypt will also be exhibiting at the IPD stand. With a long-standing tradition of mango cultivation, these experienced producers offer consistently high-quality fruit, including varieties such as Keitt, Naomi, R2E2, and Crimson.

#### Wide variety of grape cultivars

Brazilian grape producers in the IPD programme contribute an extensive selection of cultivars, including Sugar Crisp, Cherry Crush, Sweet Celebration, and Autumn Crisp. These varieties complement the grape offerings of IPD partner companies from Ecuador and Egypt, who will likewise be present at Fruit Attraction.

## A new fruit in the IPD portfolio: Brazilian lychees

For the first time, a Brazilian producer will introduce lychees under the IPD programme. At Fruit Attraction, the company will present its product range, which is expected to grow to encompass up to eight different lychee varieties.





### Strong demand for limes

Lime producers from Brazil and Colombia will also be represented at Fruit Attraction. Rising demand for limes has coincided with reduced supply due to "citrus greening," a bacterial disease affecting citrus plants. One of the Brazilian companies operates plantations in the states of Rio Grande do Norte and Bahia – regions not currently affected by the disease. Colombian companies also continue to supply the market and offer potential for establishing new trade partnerships.

#### Yams - a root crop with market potential

The yam is gaining increasing relevance in the international marketplace. A Brazilian company will showcase the variety *Dioscorea alata* at Fruit Attraction. To make the tuber more appealing for export markets, it is cleaned of fine hairs and offered in various sizes. As a result, the yam closely resembles the popular sweet potato, both in taste and appearance.
